Joan Rose Thomas passed away in August. She was the daughter of one of The Playhouse's founding families. Her father, John Manley Rose, a world-renowned artist, painted the mural in the front hall; in addition, he was responsible for donating the land on which our Playhouse sits. Joan, a gifted artist in her own right, painted the mural in the back of the auditorium as well as countless sets. She donated several of her father's paintings to The Playhouse, and they were sold to aid in our drive to air condition the auditorium. Joan's husband, Upton, was our Technical Director for many, many years. Joan and Upton were a "Playhouse" romance, along with my parents, Jack and Marianne Pyle. Joan painted a beautiful portrait of my dad when he played Major Joppolo in *A Bell for Adano*. During my 'growing up' years at The Playhouse, it was couples like Joan and Upton Thomas who worked on every play and in whatever capacity they were needed.

Director's Notes

"May the best man win!" Isn't this what we hope for, wish for, in our political idealism that somehow the system we constructed will allow the best of us to come forward, "The best and the brightest?"

Of course it's what we want but no longer believe we can achieve. Money, polarization, special interests and the 24 hour news cycle, have changed the way politics is played out in our America.

"The Best Man" is not a nostalgic look at politics but an insider's look at what goes on behind the velvet curtain. This is a morality tale of political intrigue that still rings true with an uncanny prescience about the future of American politics; raising familiar questions about God in campaigning, sexual escapades, mudslinging and the often incompatible virtues of good statesmanship and good politics, and of public and private morals.

When an ambitious young senator who would soon be president first saw *The Best Man'* 52 years ago, he was quick to point out to its author that the play's vision of politicians wasn't exactly authentic. "You know," John F. Kennedy is reported to have said to Gore Vidal, "in a campaign we don't have all that much time to talk about the meaning of it all."

Luckily for us we had Gore Vidal who had the time, wit and wisdom to not only talk about the meaning of it all but to do so with the biting humor, sharp observations and great heart that truly represent "the best and the brightest" of us.
