DIRECTOR'S NOTES

With the current popularity of all things Sherlock, the brilliant detective from Baker Street has never been more in demand. Whether in films, British or American television, as period pieces or set in contemporary society, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's creation has loomed very large in popular culture over the last several years.

William Gillette was a very real actor, writer and inventor who penned and starred in *Sherlock Holmes* a compilation of several of Conan Doyle's stories. Gillette was the first to wear the deerstalker cap and smoke the curved pipe which have become so identified with the character. He was also the first to utter the word "Elementary" to Watson, so we owe a great deal of what we perceive about Holmes to Gillette. He portrayed the detective over 1300 times during his long and illustrious career. The Gillette Castle still exists on the banks of the Connecticut River.

But enough background, tonight we take a light-hearted look at the genius of detection, through the eyes of actor, William Gillette. He attempts to channel the rational mind of his favorite character to solve a mystery, while dealing with devious divas, deadly daggers, doomed doormen, disappearing dogs and his decidedly dotty mother. Will he be able to unravel this granny knot of murder before another tragedy strikes?
